## Application for Graduate Assistantship or Fellowship

Assistantships and Fellowships are awarded primarily on the basis of a student's academic record, potential as a degree candidate, teaching, or research, activities. Applicants must be formally admitted to a graduate degree program at Đ<sub>i</sub>9Ö±¾. Students admitted on probation or placed on academic probation following admission are not eligible for such awards.

Assistantships provide cash stipends and may include tuition assessment at resident rates. Students awarded a Graduate Teaching Assistantship may qualify for up to 100% waiver of their tuition.

The actual dollar amount of an assistantship varies according to the length of the appointment, the number of hours worked per week, and the funding base within each program area. At Đ¡9Ö±²¥, assistantships for twenty hours of work per week, for a nine-month period, range from \$5,000 to \$12,000.

Fellowship selections are made on a competitive basis without regard to race, creed, gender, or national origin. The individual program area determines determines the award amounts.

## Major Responsibilities of Assistantships Defined

- A Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) either directs instruction or assists with instruction. Appointment as a GTA requires that non-native speakers of English attain a minimum score of 50 on the Test of Spoken English.
- A Graduate Research Assistant (GRA) assists faculty with their scholarly research and creative abilities.
- A Graduate Staff Assistant (GSA) assists university service and academic units in either non teaching or non-research activities.

- Address and mail your application to the chair of the department/unit in which you desire to apply for an assistantship or fellowship, Đ¡9Ö±¾, Wichi ta, KS 67260. Do not include this Application for Graduate Assistantship in your Graduate School Application packet.
- Instruct your references to submit confidential letters fo recommendation to the departmental chair as above.
- Mail application and recommendation letters to department by April 1 for fall and October 1 for spring admission.
