

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
WICHITA STATE UNIVERSITY AND SEWARD COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
May 28, 2015
Revised February 17, 2017**

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement is to provide a pathway for students to earn credit through the articulation agreement in regards to the Seward County Degree in Criminal Justice. This degree is an associate degree in Criminal Justice offered to students pursuing a Bachelor's of Science in Criminal Justice offered through the Department of Criminal Arts and Sciences at Wichita State University. For more information, please refer to the Wichita State University Catalog for all transfer students.

Students should earn at least 60 hours of real-year-ven-go work and be a resident of Seward County, Kansas, prior to applying for graduation from Wichita State University.
